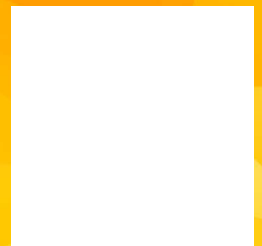

# IPC Issues in Endoscopy Course

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## COURSE INFORMATION

The course aims to equip delegates with the necessary knowledge of standards, guidelines, and best practices associated with the safe reprocessing of endoscopes in healthcare settings. Topics covered will focus on infection prevention and control issues related to endoscope reprocessing, quality assurance, environmental contamination, microbiological surveillance, and management of potential endoscopy-related infection transmission. Teaching is conducted through lectures and small group discussions.

## COURSE OBJECTIVE

The course will provide participants with enhanced knowledge and application skills required to safely reprocess endoscopes, implement quality assurance measures, identify potential risk points in the reprocessing workflow, and apply infection prevention strategies within endoscopy services.

## LEARNING OUTCOME

Upon completion of the course, the participant should be able to:

- Understand the structure and critical components of the endoscope.
- Reprocess endoscopes safely, with attention to recommended standards, guidelines, and related safety issues.
- Identify risk points associated with Automated Endoscope Reprocessors (AERs) and endoscope handling processes.
- Appreciate the importance of quality assurance and monitoring programmes in endoscope reprocessing.
- Plan, conduct, and interpret microbiological surveillance cultures of endoscopes and Automated Endoscope Reprocessors.
- Recognise environmental sources of contamination and implement preventive measures.
- Perform reviews of structure, design, and work processes in endoscopy units in comparison with international standards and guidelines.
- Develop an appropriate response to suspected endoscopy-related infection transmission incidents.

## WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Personnel and technicians working in endoscopy units, personnel involved in reprocessing endoscopes in healthcare settings, infection prevention and control personnel, microbiology laboratory personnel, nurse managers, and healthcare professionals involved in the quality and safety of endoscopy services.

## PREREQUISITE

Healthcare workers working in endoscopy unit or infection prevention personnel with at least a year of experience in their field.
